**Job Description:**

The adjunct lecturer will:

- teach a ½ credit course in the Fall and a ½ credit course in the Spring
  - Fall course is scheduled to meet 7 times in the semester every other Wednesday from 3-5:30pm (planned for in-person, but may be shifted to online)
  - Spring course is scheduled to meet every Thursday from 4 – 5:30pm (planned for in-person, but may be shifted to online)
- Prepare presentations and provide lectures related to preparing MAT students for a multilingual learner endorsement.
- Assess student understanding of course objectives through examination of lesson plans, projects, presentations, and other course assignments.
- Provide feedback on student teaching (in-person, virtual, or recorded video)
- Create four in-person workshops and/or online modules that prepare secondary general education teachers to work effectively with multilingual learners in their classrooms.
- Collaborate with other faculty in the teacher education program.
- Attend biweekly teacher education faculty meetings

**Requirements:**

Must have a master's degree or higher in Education, Linguistics, Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages, or related content fields.

At least 5 years of teaching experience working with multilingual learners in the K-12 setting

Experience in the teaching, coaching, and/or supervision of teachers, preferred

Strong knowledge of and expertise in the research and pedagogy on language acquisition for adolescent emerging bilingual students

An ability to work closely and productively with school and university colleagues

A commitment to advancing educational equity in urban schools

Ability to work effectively in the online learning setting
