

Brown University Adjunct Lecturer in Special Education

Job Description:

The adjunct lecturer will:

- co-teach a ½ credit course with a Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT) Faculty Member
 - Course is scheduled to meet 7 times in the semester every other Wednesday from 3-5:30pm (planned for in-person, but may be shifted to online)
- Prepare presentations and provide lectures related to the special education objectives for MAT students.
 - o explore the various categories of human exceptionality keeping in mind that variation exists at the individual level;
 - review the main laws and policies that inform your work with exceptional students:
 - o study Individualized Education Programs and 504 plans and their implications for instruction;
 - o study the Universal Design for Learning (UDL) framework for differentiation
 - discuss different models for collaborations with school professionals and parents; and
 - o access research and resources that support your work with these students.
- Assess student understanding of course objectives through examination of lesson plans, projects, presentations, and other course assignments.
- Create two in-person or online workshops/modules that prepare secondary general education teachers to work effectively with special education students in their classrooms.
- Collaborate in a deep and meaningful way outside of class with the co-instructor of the course to create the lessons for the course
