Brown University's Department of Education seeks an outstanding teacher educator with a commitment to advancing educational equity in urban schools to join our dynamic and growing department as a Lecturer in Social Studies Education beginning in summer 2020. The faculty member in this position will provide leadership, teaching, supervision and advising to each cohort of social studies pre-service teachers in an intensive one-year Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT). The program cultivates deep partnerships with Providence area schools with significant ethnic and linguistic diversity. All teacher education faculty members contribute to the professional development of student teachers as well as local teachers in partner schools.

The faculty member will teach graduate courses in teacher education; supervise student-teacher experiences; participate in the recruitment and admissions process of the MAT program; contribute to the professional development of teachers at partnership sites; and teach additional undergraduate courses in areas of expertise related to education. The position is for a three-year renewable term with the potential for promotion. The faculty member teaches in all semesters of an eleven-month program and participates in the summer MAT program that provides MAT candidates with their first teaching experience with urban youth.

Applicants must have a master's degree or a doctorate in Education, Ethnic Studies, Social Studies Education, History, or related content fields. A doctorate is preferred. Applicants must also have significant experience in secondary teaching; the teaching and supervision of new teachers; strong knowledge of and expertise in secondary social studies pedagogy including national standards related to the discipline; an ability to work closely and productively with school and university colleagues; and a commitment to advancing educational equity in urban schools. Additionally, the search committee encourages applicants who bring professional expertise in supporting linguistic diversity and the shifting student demographics in public schools; sustaining equitable, culturally responsive and inclusive learning environments; supporting students with disabilities and learning differences; promoting social-emotional development in adolescents; teacher preparation and development across the career; and/or strengthening communities and networks of practice.
